We Dare To Say:

Year of Prayer: As part of the Year of Prayer the Bishops of England and Wales have produced a series of reflections called 'We Dare to Say" which looks at the petitions of the Our Father in five ready-to-use sessions. Each session includes scripture, prayers and a reflection with questions. The connection of the Our Father with the sacraments and the devotional life is explored, and wisdom from the saints is offered for the spiritual growth of group participants and individuals alike. These sessions are on Mondays at 7.00 p.m. at St. Anne's and Tuesdays 7.00pm at St. Austin's and continue throughout Lent. Both the Monday and Tuesday session will focus on the identical topic but will provide folk with a choice of evening. All are very welcome.

To parishioners of both St Patrick's and St Anne's: as you will be aware the complete Holy Week Triduum will be celebrated in the three churches this year [as last]. We must understand that the Church guidelines advise that for such a liturgical celebration to be worthy the essential elements, such as readings, the music/hymns, serving and help with setting up, liturgy, lighting etc. should be present. This should reflect the keen participation of parishioners who are indispensable in such services. This weekend I have left sheets out at the back of church for parishioners to volunteer for assisting in a variety of roles. Please do give this serious consideration. Synodality insists that, as CHURCH COMMUNITY, we play our part fully in all facets of church life.
