"We.... believe that the reasons which have prevented Catholics from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation no longer apply. "We understand there will still be some members of our congregations who, for reasons of health, do not feel safe enough to return to Mass. It has always been the understanding of the Church that when the freedom of any Catholic to attend Mass in person is impeded for a serious reason, because of situations such as ill health, care for the sick or legitimate fear, this is not a breach of the Sunday Obligation."*

St Bernadette Relic Tour: In October this year, the relics of St Bernadette will journey on pilgrimage to England, Scotland, and Wales for the very first time. As part of the pilgrimage, the relics will come to Our Lady of Lourdes in Hednesford on 8th and 9th October. There will be more details about this in the coming weeks. **NB:** To ensure the comfort and safety of pilgrims, and to allow for the potentially large numbers, individuals and groups are strongly encouraged to register their attendance at their earliest convenience choosing a free, dedicated timeslot at their chosen church or cathedral. Fr Stephen Fleming has been appointed as Assistant Priest of St Austin's and will be arriving at the end of August. We offer our congratulations to him, and pray for him in these early days since his ordination to the Sacred Priesthood. A few years back, Fr Stephen did a Pastoral Placement at St Austin's, so he might be familiar to a few people.

'On this glad Assumption day, honour to Our Lady pay' is the opening line of a lesser known hymn to Our Lady. It speaks about the heavens welcoming Our Lady and those gathered in prayer rejoicing at her assumption. **At 5.00pm on Sunday 14th August at St Austin's** there will be a time of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, during which we shall pray Vespers for the Assumption. This will conclude with Benediction and a short procession to the grotto in the Presbytery gardens.

Aid to the Church in Need Mass at 3.00pm on Sunday 14th August in Our Lady of Lourdes in Hednesford. The Mass will be offered for our persecuted brothers and sisters in Christ throughout the world. The preacher will be Mgr. Danny McHugh, the Diocesan Ethnic Chaplaincy Coordinator. After the Mass, we will have refreshments, followed by a presentation given by Dr Caroline Hull, the National Director of Aid to the Church in Need. There will be an opportunity for discussion, questions and answers. Finally, there will be an opportunity to purchase religious items made in Ukraine as well as in the Holy Land – through these sales Aid to the Church in Need offers dignity and hope to those in need.
